Our <u>Master of Natural Resources (MNR)</u> is a flexible, interdisciplinary off-campus graduate degree designed to accommodate working adults:

- · Diverse undergrad majors welcomed
- · Graduate in as few as 12 months
- 30-credit, non-thesis degree
- 10-day Global Study
- No GRE required
- A background in environmental science is not required
- Admission decisions are based on both academic and professional experience
- · No additional cost for out-of-state or international students
- Executive program meets 11 times a year (5 on campus + 6 virtually)
- Accelerated Undergraduate/Graduate program option is available for Virginia Tech students
